

Take home stone-ground, preservative-free flours, grits and cornmeal found at Virginia's oldest, continuously operating commercial grist mill, **Wade's Mill**, a registered Virginia Landmark also on the National Register of Historic Places.

Choose from nearly 50 sites to experience patio sunsets, family-friendly atmospheres (welcoming kids and dogs) and tasty beverages to enjoy with friends. Sample from 16 brews at **Stable Craft Brewing**, located at **Hermitage Hill Farm and Stables** (a real working farm you can tour), complete with incredible views of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Or, try **Winchester Ciderworks**, a marriage of old world tradition with new world know-how, featuring locally grown apples from the Shenandoah Valley.






